



“BOO TO YOU” VINE PUMPKIN

SUPPLIES:

- Vine pumpkin #3101-774
- 5 ea. Wood ghosts #9133-53
- Scrap book letters #BVSP06
- Rusty star wreath #6562-79
- Rusty star candle cover #6562-81
- Small ivy candle ring #MC1981
- Ceramcoat acrylic paint:
 - Buttercream, black, golden brown
- Electric candle with orange bulb #6419 / #6203-31
- Rusty bells #1019-07
- Pumpkin picks # DS1734 / DS1733
- Piece of 2”x2” floral foam
- Fall ribbon of choice for a bow
- Scrap ivy garland, Modge podge, hot glue, brown chenille stems, wire cutters



PUTTING IT TOGETHER.....

1. Paint the fronts and edges of the ghosts with Buttercream paint. Use golden brown to lightly shade the sides. Let dry. Paint faces with the black.
2. Lay the ghosts side by side –the first 3 ghosts will each have a letter to spell BOO. The fourth ghost will have TO, and the fifth ghost will say YOU.
3. Paint each of the ghosts with a coat of Modge podge to seal. Let dry completely.
4. Hot glue a rusty bell to the end of each of the ghost’s hands.
5. Unfold the vine pumpkin and use brown chenille at the top to hold it open.
6. Cut one side of the stem and bend it out of the way. Push the piece of floral foam down onto top of pumpkin and glue into place.
7. Remove felt from the bottom of the candle and glue it to top of foam.
8. Cut small strips of brown chenille and use the pieces to wire the cord down one side of the pumpkin.
9. Cut the star wreath in half with wire cutters. Wire one half to the bottom of the pumpkin.
10. Cut the other half of the wreath into 2 unequal pieces. Hot glue the longer piece into the foam, pointing up. Glue the shorter piece pointing down.
11. Slide candle cover onto the candle and add the orange bulb.
12. Cut the candle ring into 4 pieces. Arrange over the foam so that it is covered and glue into place. Make a bow and arrange on top front of pumpkin. Add the pumpkin picks.
13. Wire the scrap piece of ivy on the inside bottom of the pumpkin and add some pumpkin picks.
14. Glue on the ghosts. *refer to photo.
