Tips for Crafting with your Children!

For kid's crafts all you need is a table with protective covering and a few basic craft supplies on hand.

Children love to color, cut, and glue!

The craft supplies that I would recommend always having on hand are; safety scissors, glue, glue sticks, or glue dots, washable markers, assorted colored pipe cleaners, and construction paper. With these basic craft supplies children and parents can have hours of fun. Some fun craft ideas are making "thinking of you cards" to mail to distant family members (children love to send and receive mail), themed holiday decorations for their bedroom or the house and fun colorful pictures to hang on the refrigerator.

Re-use items around your home for craft supplies. I can't stress enough you do not need a huge amount of expensive craft supplies to do crafts with your children. You can easily use items from around your home for crafts, as well.

- Washed soup cans are fun to paint and turn into a pencil and pen holder.
- Uncooked macaroni works great for beading necklaces.
- Plastic water bottles can be painted, filled with beans and turned into maracas.
- Old buttons work great for gluing on paper.
- Even rocks from outside can be painted and turned into fun magical little creatures.

When you do purchase craft supplies buy them frugally. There is no need to pay full price when you don't have to.

- Purchase holiday themed craft supplies after the holiday and store them away for the following year.
- Use in-store coupons or watch for store sales on children's crafts.
- Visit the Dollar Store they often have a wide variety of inexpensive craft items.
- Search Craig's List or Ebay for used children's craft supplies.



Rock n' Roll Mini Mouse

SUPPLIES:

- Smooth oval-like rock
- 2 Pipe Cleaners
- Adhesive Googly Eyes
- Small Pompom
- Glue or Glue Dots



PUTTING IT TOGETHER.....



1. Begin by gathering all the materials you will need for this project. Rocks can be found outside and cleaned with soap in the sink.



2. Place a rock onto the center of a pipe cleaner. Wrap the pipe cleaner around the rock tightly.



3. Form the pipe cleaner ends into mouse ears. Place a small glue dot underneath the ears to hold pipe cleaner securely to the rock.



4. Take another pipe cleaner and wrap the end of it around the bottom center of the pipe cleaner from step 3.



5. Curl the pipe cleaner into a mouse tail shape.



6. Attach two adhesive backed googly eyes to the mouse's head.



7. Attach a small pompom to the rock for the mouse's nose. Use either a "glue dot" or a small dot of glue.



8. Take this craft a step further and have children use their imagination to make a home and food for their new pet.



Picture Perfect

1. Begin by gathering all the materials you will need for this project. Darice products can always easily be found at Joann Fabrics.



2. Take the picture frame and foamies out of the packaging. Let children use their imagination to design their own picture frame.



3. Display the picture frame proudly or give as a gift.



4. Have children use the extra foamies to make their own masterpieces.



Piggy Bank

SUPPLIES:

- Small Water Bottle
- Pink & Black Paint Acrylic or Finger-paints
- Pink Paper
- Black Crayon
- Pink Pipe Cleaner
- Googly Eyes with Adhesive Backs
- Glue or Glue Dots



PUTTING IT TOGETHER.....



1. Begin by gathering all the materials you will need for this project. Wash the label off of a small water bottle. Allow the water bottle to dry before working with.



2. Use either acrylic paints or finger-paints to paint the water bottle (except for cap). If pink paint is not available; mix white and red paint.



3. Place the water bottle on its cap to let it dry.



4. Once the water bottle is dry, turn it over and paint the cap and the top neck of the bottle.



5. When everything is dry screw the cap back onto the water bottle. Use black paint to design the pig snout.



6. Attach two googly eyes.



7. Use pink paper to cut two triangles for the pig's ears. Fold the ends of the ears over so that they can easily be glued to the top of the bottle. Color the inside of the pig's ears with a black crayon.



8. Glue the ears to the bottle with either glue or glue dots.



9. Use a pink pipe cleaner to attach to the bottom of the water bottle. Glue dots work the best to adhere the pipe cleaner to the water bottle. Shape the pipe cleaner into a pig's tail.



10. Children can display their homemade eco-friendly piggy bank in their room. Just unscrew the nose to place pennies, nickels, and dimes into the pig.

SUPPLIES:

- Mini Bowdabra with Mini Bowdabra Wand
- Bowdabra Bow Wire
- Metallic Scrunchy Ribbon
- Assorted Colored Pipe Cleaners



PUTTING IT TOGETHER.....



1. Begin by gathering all the materials you will need for this project.



2. Cut a 24" piece of Bowdabra Bow Wire and fold it in half. Lay it into the Mini Bowdabra. You'll have a loop at one end and two loose pieces at the opposite end.



3. Fold a pipe cleaner in half and place it into the center of the Mini Bowdabra.



4. Take another pipe cleaner fold it in half and place the ends into the Mini Bowdabra. Form the pipe cleaner into a wing. Fold another pipe cleaner in half and place the ends into Mini Bowdabra. Form the wing on the other side.



5. Take another pipe cleaner for the bee's stinger and fold it in half and place it into the center of the Mini Bowdabra.



6. Use metallic scrunchy ribbon and fold it down inside of the Mini Bowdabra.



7. Continue to fold the metallic scrunchy ribbon down into the Mini Bowdabra like an accordion. Cut the ribbon when it reaches the top of the Mini Bowdabra towers.



8. Scrunch down with the Mini Bowdabra Wand.



9. While the bow is still in the Bowdabra, thread the two loose ends of the Bowdabra Bow Wire through the loop at the other end.



10. Pull the Bowdabra Bow Wire tightly while the bow is still in the Bowdabra.



11. Gently pull the bow out of the Mini Bowdabra. Separate the two loose ends of the Bowdabra Bow Wire and bring them around to the back of the bow. To tie off the bow, pinch the Bowdabra Bow Wire securely against the bow. Twist the bow 4 to 6 times in a clockwise direction and knot.



12. Use the Bowdabra Bow wire to make a large loop hanger for the bumblebee.



13. Fluff the scrunchy bow.



14. Form the bee's antennas and bottom stinger.



15. **Variation:** To make a butterfly follow the same directions except skip step 5.



16. Use the Bowdabra Wire loop hanger to hang your insects.



St. Patrick's Day Card

SUPPLIES:

- Black & Green Construction Paper
- Ric Rac
- Adhesive Gem (Optional)
- Glue or Glue Dots



PUTTING IT TOGETHER.....



1. Begin by gathering all the materials you will need for this project.



2. Fold a piece of black construction paper in half.



3. Fold paper in half again.



4. Use the picture to the left as a guide for cutting the leprechaun's hat.



5. Unfold the paper once. It should look like this.



6. To make the clover cut out three hearts and a stem.



7. Glue the points of the hearts together to form the clover. Add the stem.



 $8.\ Dress\ the\ card\ up\ with\ ric\ rac,\ gems,\ and\ other\ fun\ embellishments.$



10. Once card front has dried glue a piece of green paper on the inside.



11. Have children write a fun message inside.



12. Put in an envelope and mail!

Facts

What is the Bowdabra®?

The Bowdabra® (pronounced like "abracadabra") is an easy-to-use crafting tool people use to make professional-looking, hand-tied bows at home.

What types of things can a Bowdabra® be used for?

Just about any type of material can be used in a Bowdabra® to create beautiful bows for gifts, baskets, home décor, bridal decorations, hair accessories, and more.

How does the Bowdabra® work?

The Bowdabra's patented design makes it simple to create medium to large bows. The process begins by inserting a piece of ribbon wire into the Bowdabra®. Then, material is either scrunched or folded on top of the wire to achieve the bow size and fullness desired. Once the material is in, the Bowdabra Wand is used to compact the material onto the ribbon wire. The wire is then tied, and the bow can be removed from the Bowdabra®. Once removed, the bow can be fluffed, arranged, and retied to the maker's liking.

Who is Sandy Sandler?

Sandy Sandler is the creative mind behind the Bowdabra®. She owned a corporate gift company that created gift baskets and other items in need of bows and found it difficult to train employees to create them by hand. Sandy tried other bow-making tools on the market, but they were difficult to use and did not produce the result she was looking for.

Certain there had to be a better way to quickly and easily create bows; Sandy hired a design engineer to help develop what became the Bowdabra®.

Did Sandy Sandler invent the Bowdabra®?

While Sandy takes credit for recognizing the need for a better way to make bows, she shares the spotlight with her team of designers that helped make her dream a reality. Patents for the Bowdabra® are in Sandy's name.

Where are Bowdabras® sold?

Bowdabras can be found in retail stores like ACMoore, Michael's, Hancock Fabrics, and Garden Ridge. They are also available online at www.Bowdabra.com. Many owner-operated craft shops stock Bowdabra® as well. Check with your local craft supply store.

How much does a Bowdabra® cost?

The exact pricing for the Bowdabra® varies slightly between retailers, but remains inexpensive in the range of \$14.99 to \$30.00, depending on the kit configuration. When you factor in the money saved not having to buy manufactured bows, the Bowdabra® practically pays for itself.
